jute project by DMWSC was covered in the local newspaper.


International Women's Day at Gayaganga and Lolay

DMWSC staff spoke about the importance of Women's day. The topic was on Domestic Violence and Human trafficking. The team had a street play on domestic violence to show the community women and various laws was shared with them.

DMWSC staff spoke on different types of violence and the

related laws by which victims



can ask for their rights and entitlements. The women were made aware on different types of human trafficking and the different causes leading to trafficking. The women should be alert in everything especially when it comes to dealing with children. They were asked to be careful of unknown persons who come to the village and try to make a good rapport with the community to lure them with money ,marriage and good jobs. The women were also given a

CHILDLINE number 1098 which is a toll free number for

children .In case any child goes missing or any child is in need of care and protection they can dial 1098.

Sr. Helen spoke about the importance of the **Self help groups** and how the government is giving opportunity to the self help group women to become leaders and earn their own livelihood. She laid emphasis on "Unity! Love! Service!" These three key words need to be there for a community to develop.

Awareness Program on Domestic Violence and Anti Human Trafficking



With the New Year the Community Awareness Programme, on the issue of Domestic Violence and Anti Human Trafficking was conducted in different tea plantation where DMWSC operates. From January to March separate events were held on the concerned issue. Sessions were held at Bakrakot Tea Plantation (2nd, 6th,13thFebruary, 6th and 27th March), Kumlai Tea Plantation(9th February and 20th March), Leeshriver Tea Plantation (8th February), Washabari Tea Plantation (12th and 25th February), Ellenbari Tea plantation (14th March) In total, more than 550 community members have taken part, learning about the importance of standing up for their rights.

The field associates used very simple methods to make them understand. They explained about what human trafficking is, who are trafficked, who the human traffickers are, and why they do it. They spoke about what domestic violence is, and how to overcome this problem. They also focused on child marriage and said it is very dangerous for the child and the mother and that they should not force their children to get married at an early age. Child marriage is creating problems in the families, because the mother and the new born child will be unhealthy.



Youth awareness program on alcoholism



DMWSC organized youth awareness programs in different tea plantations. The sessions were held in Bakrakote Tea plantation (15th February and 13th March), Leeshriver Tea Plantation (16th February and 12th March) Washabari Tea plantation (22nd February) Kumlai Tea Plantation (15th March). The field associates focused on how alcoholism is affecting the youth today. The associates told the youth that consumption of liquor will not only affect them physically but will also affect them mentally, emotionally and financially.

Gender awareness

An awareness programme on **Gender** was organized on 5th February, at Nischintapur Tea Plantation, Siptiguri Tea Plantation and Sanyasi Tea Plantation on 6th February and at Patanphulpari Tea Plantation on 13th February 2018. Several men, women, children and youth were present. DMWSC staff explained the awareness of Gender discrimination to the people. They made the people aware by telling them that parents should not discriminate between a boy and a girl. Parents should raise their children equally. They should provide food, clothes, love, proper care etc. A girl has every right to go to school and to be educated. They made them understand that a boy and a girl is different physically only. Equality does not mean that women should be the same as men. Promoting equality recognizes that men and women have different roles and needs and these need to be taken into account in development, planning and programming.

Orientation program for Basic Computer and Spoken English



DMWSC started Basic Computer and Spoken English project in the month of February to the children of the tea plantation. There are 65 children who are learning basic computer and 22 children learning English. On 10th March 2018 orientation program was conducted to these children. DMWSC intends to provide opportunity to the children and youth of the tea plantations by providing the course which would be for their benefit.
